- Note: A typeface should always have a border. Think of it as the type being in its world & secluding itself.
- 72 pt size was the highest ∵ it was about the size of an inch. These were made out of metal. When they went over 72 pt, they started using wood type.
- When the pt. size increased, the size of punctuation got reduced so that punctuation doesn't overpower type.

◦ White will always be the most powerful contrasting color. So, use it to create contrast.



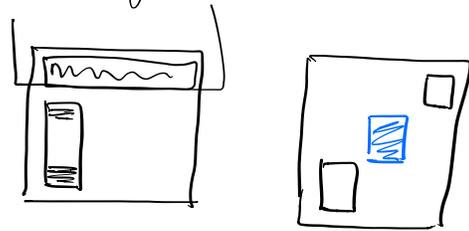
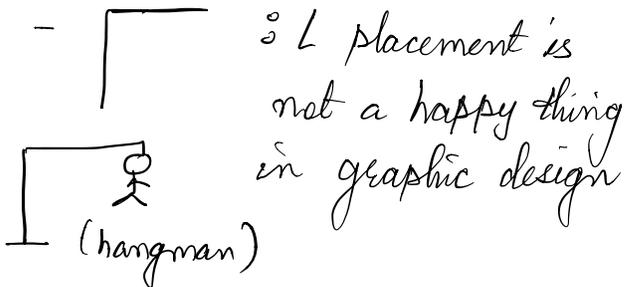
