o Relating Emolens to Soundland story

① Dexter realizes that Gigi & her crew are emotionally activated under the Social God's influence. He found that eyes were accurate detectors of emotional state.

② So, he created a contact lens that detects emotional state of Gigi (& others) & prompts them when they may make emotionally inclined (irrational) decision. He packaged it as a luxury lens called Emolens so that Gigi (& others) wear it as a form of jewellery.

③ Emotens becomes popular instantly & Gigi wears it first. Soon after that, she starts getting prompted with alerts, helping her manage her emotional state. At first, she gets afraid of having sth overlaid on her sight, but after wearing them for a week, she understands the bubble she was caught up in & tries to be more logical.

- ↳ Annotated Bibliography: share the details of why you chose that reference.

↳ **Literature Review**: Warming people up who haven't done your research & set stage about your work

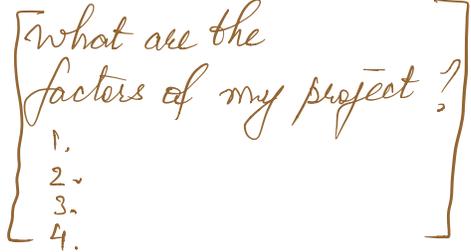

- User testing: may not be a part of the process
- Write out what you did, who you talked & all the reasons as to why
- Documenting & see if there are patterns, if \exists a cause-effect relationship \rightarrow + examples
- What worked & what didn't
- Organized in discrete parts (methods); tie them together in a way that makes sense.
 - \hookrightarrow what were the phases of your project?
- Name it - name your process (others may find it useful)
 - \hookrightarrow You may adopt the name of a conventional process.
 - \hookrightarrow Put it in relation to other things

Giving order to the above questions

* Self-reflection on the process

- gather documentation & analyze for process
- write out what you did & why you did all these things
- what worked & what didn't (decide what to include & not)
- Organize into methods & put them in an order/process
- Name it/put a twist on a more conventional methodology
- How did your question justify methods (or vice versa)
- How does that process relate to others' & my field?
- what was the question & how did it evolve?
- How does each step lead to the final form? \rightarrow Evaluation / Discussion

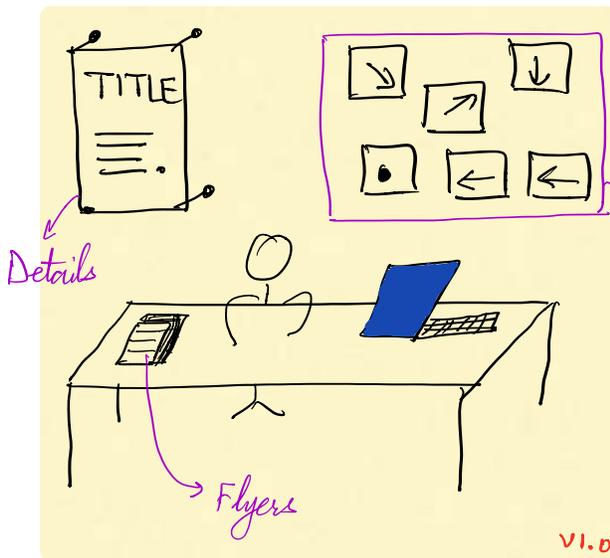

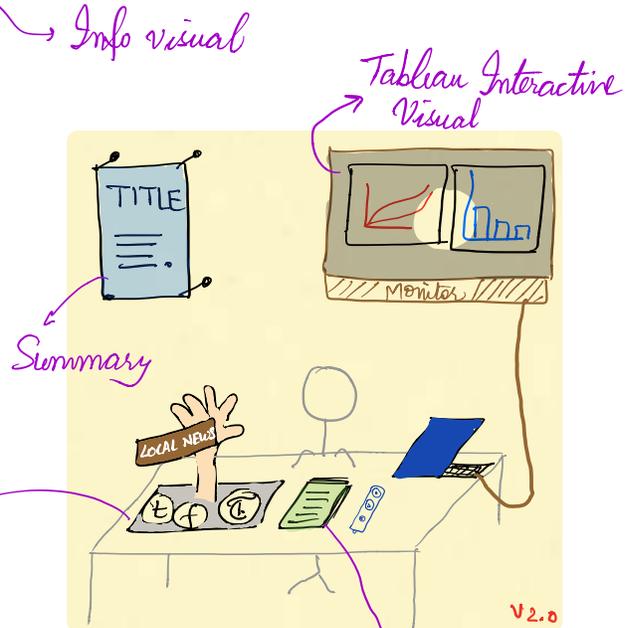

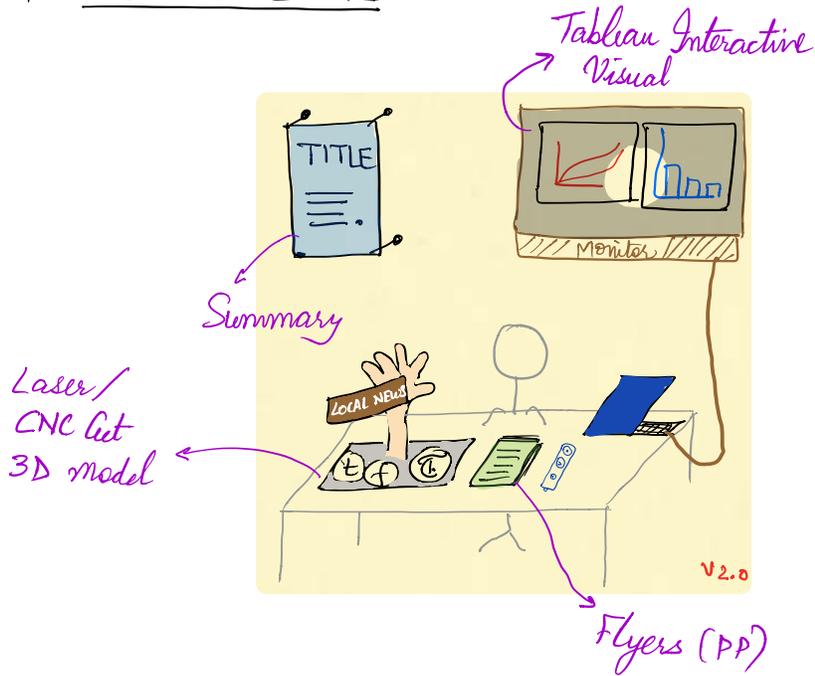
